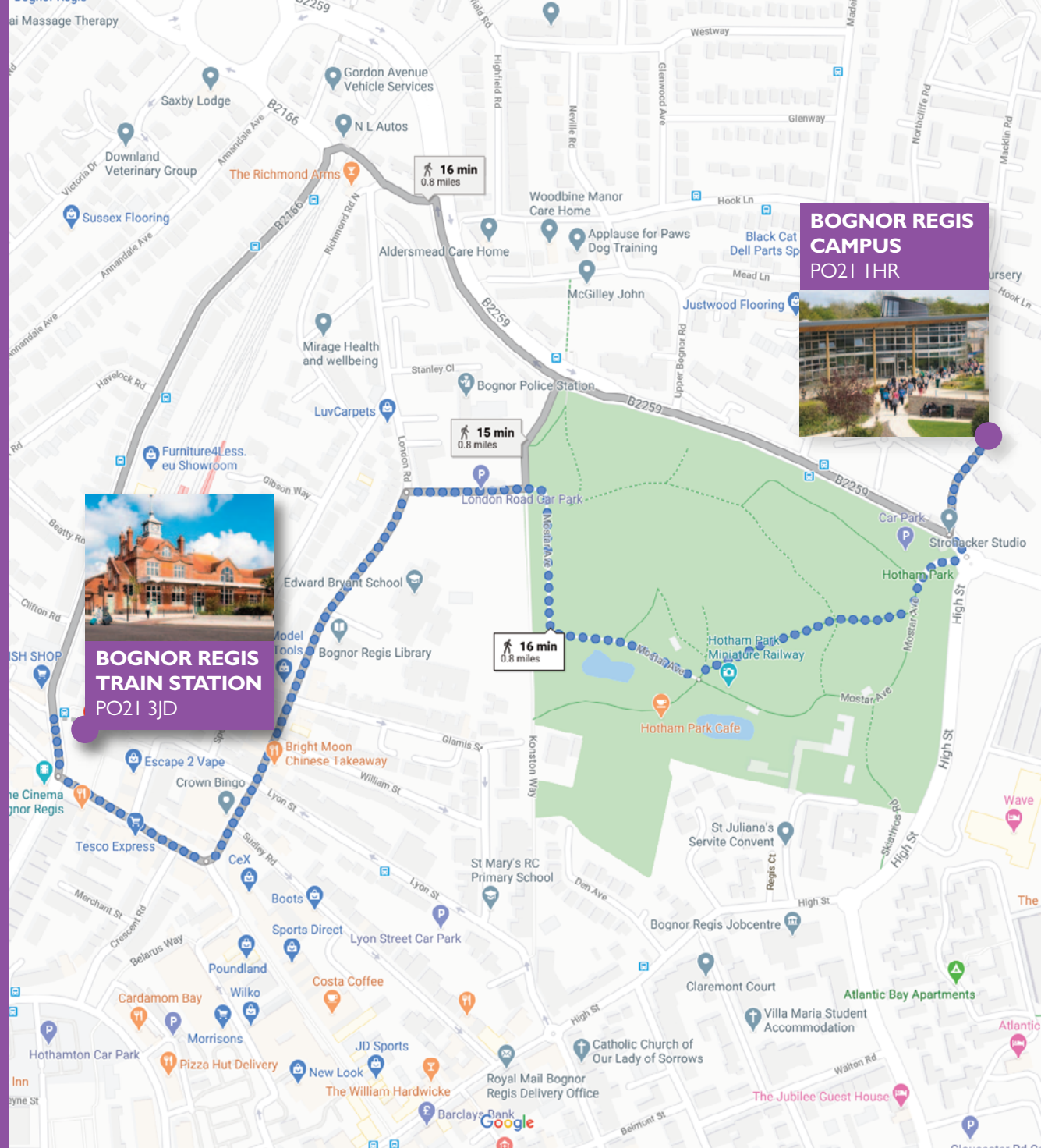

Walking Directions to the Bognor Regis Campus from Bognor Regis Train Station

Exit **Bognor Regis Station** by the side door on the left (taxi rank entrance) onto **Lyon Street West**. Turn right onto **(Station Road)** and continue along Station Road until it meets the **London Road Shopping Precinct**.

Walk down the entire length of the precinct until it meets High Street. Turn left and follow **High Street**, continuing straight on past two mini roundabouts until High Street meets **Upper Bognor Road** at another mini roundabout.

Bognor Regis Campus is straight in front of you. Please take care crossing this busy road.



A few facts about Bognor Regis

- Bognor Regis started life as a fishing village which has grown to become one of the UK's most famous seaside resorts and home to the Butlins Bognor Regis Resort, the largest holiday centre in the South of England.
- In 1928 King George V came here to convalesce after a serious illness. After he left the council applied for permission to add Regis to the town's name and the permission was granted. Bognor was given the title "Regis" in 1929.
- Bognor Regis has a pier which took some 18 months to complete. It was opened on the 4th May 1865.
- During the Second World War the pier was used by the Royal Navy as an observation station. It was renamed as HMS Patricia.
- Butlins Bognor Regis opened its gates in 1960. There is a waterpark, spa and restaurants for you to take advantage of and it's across the road from the campus.
- The main attraction of Bognor Regis is its long stretch of coastline, with a mixture of sandy and pebble beaches. Here you can take long walks or enjoy sailing, windsurfing, jet skiing and many other water sport activities. The Bognor Regis campus is only 915 footsteps from the beach.
- The town centre is just a short, easy walk from the campus. Here you can find a range of shops, restaurants, pubs, bars and a nightclub which is on the pier. Also nearby is the Picturedrome Cinema, a Grade II listed building where ticket prices are lower than the average cinema ticket, and the Regis Centre. This is a multi-purpose arts centre that is home to the Alexander Theatre, an art gallery and dance studio.

SURROUNDING AREAS

By train

- Portsmouth is 40 minutes away

By car
