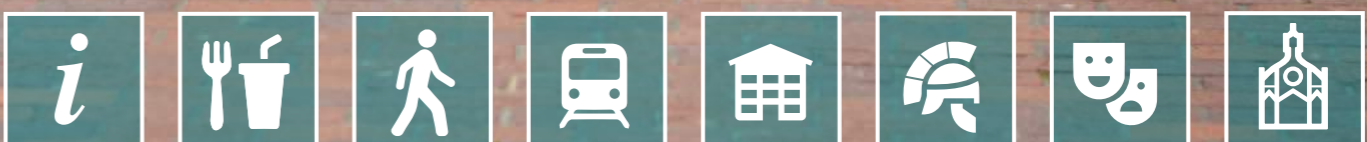


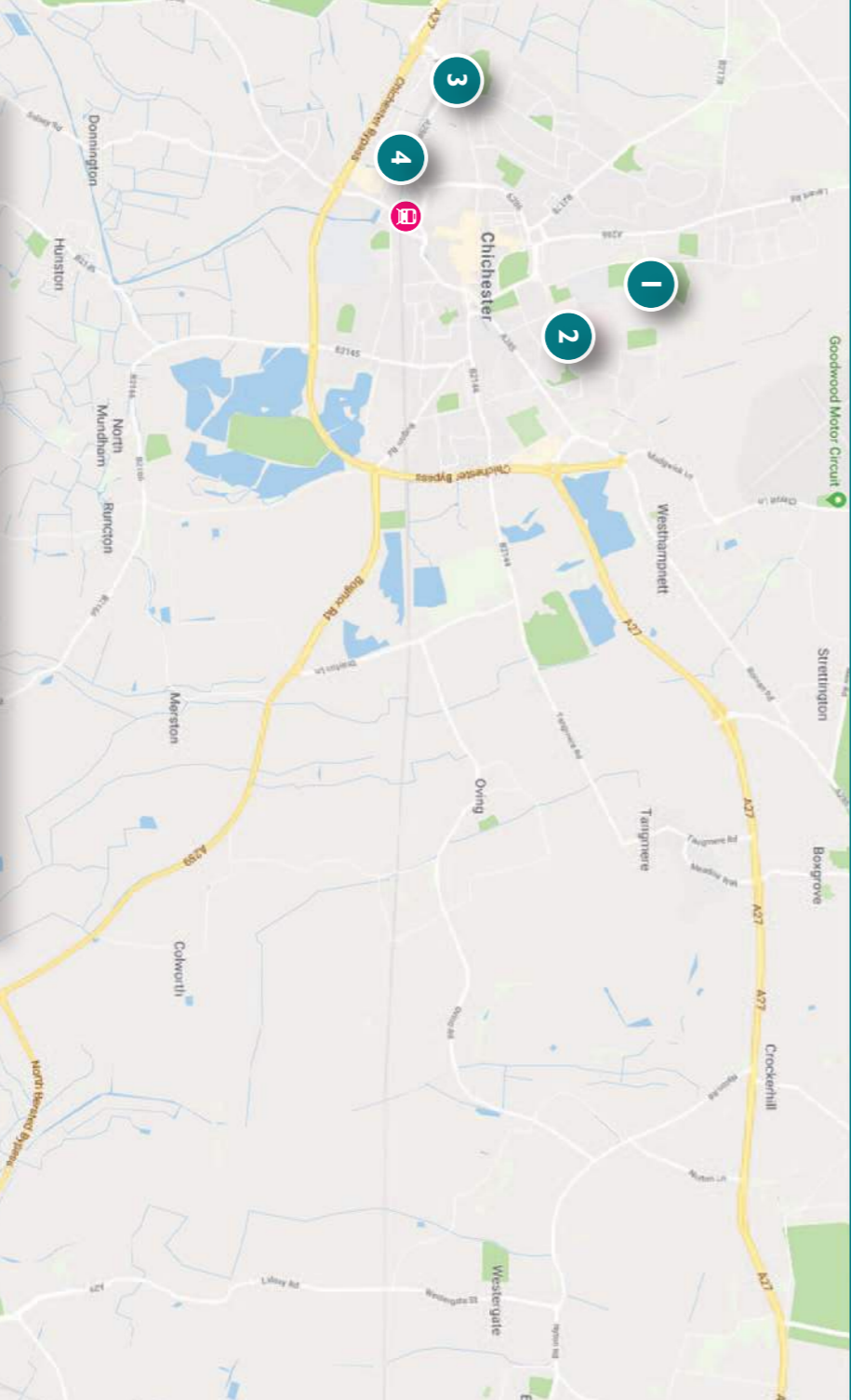
Self-guided tour of Chichester

There is a great choice of university managed accommodation we are able to offer with different room types ranging from ensuite to shared facilities, catered to self-catered and studio apartments either as single or dual occupancy.

When you apply for accommodation you do not choose by property name. Instead you choose Chichester, Bognor Regis or university managed properties (off-campus) as the campus, ensuite or shared (standard/superior) facilities and catered or self-catered in a preference order. This is allocated using a randomised lottery-based system, not first-come, first-served. 1 Chichester campus PO19 6PE

Our Bishop Otter campus offers five different types of accommodation, ranging from ensuite, superior shared and shared facilities whilst offering catered or self-catered packages. Here you are located within the heart of the campus with all facilities just minutes away.

2 Chichester off-campus accommodation

- 19 Millfield Close, PO19 6UR (Ensuite/Self-Catered)
 - 47 Spitalfield Lane, PO19 6SG (Ensuite/Self-Catered)
 - 37 Lewis Road, PO19 7LZ (Shared Facilities/Self-Catered)
- Our newest off-campus accommodation offers self-catered, ensuite or shared facilities. Each accommodation has six rooms.

3 Fishbourne Road East Halls PO19 3FH

Fishbourne Road East is a great option for our students who wish to branch out into the local community, whilst still being able to offer our 24-hour support and security. Located within a one minute walk of a Tesco Superstore and has direct, free bus links to both the Chichester and Bognor Regis campuses.

4 Stockbridge Halls PO19 8FG Sathaw: PO19 8GP

Stockbridge Halls has over 400 rooms on an ensuite, self-catered basis. Located in the heart of Chichester city centre next to the Chichester Gate leisure complex consisting of Cineworld, Tenpin Bowling, numerous restaurants and a gym.

5 Prince Of Wales PO22 8BQ

Prince of Wales offers a high standard of off-campus accommodation located in the Bognor Regis area. Offering self-catered, ensuite packages and studio apartments either as single or dual occupancy. It is a five-minute walk from the Bognor Regis campus.

6 Bognor Regis campus PO21 1HR

Our Bognor Regis campus is home to two types of catered accommodation, offering both ensuite and shared facilities. Here you are located in the heart of the campus with all facilities just minutes away and only a nine-minute walk to Bognor's award winning beach.

7 Garth House PO21 1HQ

Our newest off-campus accommodation located in the Bognor Regis area. Offering self-catered, ensuite packages and studio apartments. It is a five-minute walk from the Bognor Regis campus.

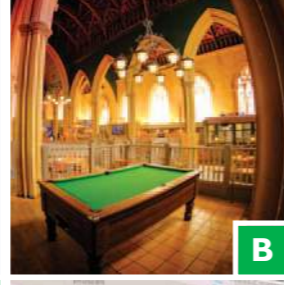
8 Villa Maria PO21 1NW

Villa Maria offers a high standard of off-campus accommodation located in Bognor Regis. Offering self-catered, ensuite packages and studio apartments either as single or dual occupancy. It is a 10-minute walk from the Bognor Regis campus.

Places of interest



- A Chichester Festival Theatre**
Many shows held at the theatre make it onto the West End!
- B Crane Street**
A lovely lane in the heart of Chichester with quaint cafes and charity shops.
- C Market Cross**
Erected 1501 by Bishop Edward Story. He gave £10 to the Mayor of Chichester for the ground - this is equal to around £7,853.44 now. The purpose of the structure was to allow peasants with only a handful of produce to sell their product without paying any trading fees, under the premise they were protected by the cross. The structure has undergone a few changes since 1501 and in 1950 became a staple of Chichester's history, protected under the Ancient Monument Areas Act 1979. More information can be found at the Novium Museum and the original bust of Charles I, found on the west side of the structure, is currently in the Pallant House Gallery.
- D Chichester Cathedral**
The cathedral was built almost 10 years after the successful invasion of William the Conqueror. It is the only cathedral in the UK that still has its original detached medieval bell tower and features famous Tudor art. The university has previously held graduation ceremonies here!
- E Bishops Palace**
The Bishop's Palace is not often open to the public; however, you can view it on the way to the Palace gardens if you enter via an archway at the end of Canon Lane in The Close. The palace gardens feature a picturesque fountain and shaded areas for those summer days!
- F Train Station**
Chichester train station is a 20 minute walk from the Chichester campus and has direct trains to London, Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton.
- G Chichester Gate**
Chichester Gate is an entertainment complex containing the likes of a cinema, bowling alley, restaurants and more.
- H Pallant Gallery**
Modern British Art Gallery, exhibiting art from 1900 to now.
- I Oxmarket Gallery**
Oxmarket Gallery is a charity that has been running since 1976. It is based in a medieval deconsecrated church. In 2022, the works of nine graduates from the University of Chichester were exhibited at the gallery, showing the hard work and brilliance of our alumni!

Walking route



- 1 Leave Chichester campus, heading left on College Lane.
- 2 Follow the road all the way down until you make it to a T-junction with a Co-op across the road.
- 3 At this T-junction, head right down the B2178 and onto the A286. On the right-hand side, you will find the Chichester Festival Theatre and its car park.
- 4 Follow this road until you get to the underpass. You will come out onto North Street.
- 5 On the right-hand side just past Leaders, you will find the Roman Walls down North Walls road.
- 6 Keep heading towards the Market Cross and you will find Crane Street on the right-hand side by West Cornwall Food Co.
- 7 At the Market Cross, at the centre of Chichester, you have three options to explore:
 - 7a West Street, which features Chichester Cathedral and the Duke & Rye bar.
 - 7b South Street, which leads to the Bishops Palace and Gardens via an archway at the end of Canon Lane at the Close. With Chichester train station, Chichester Gate and Stockbridge accommodation further along.
 - 7c East Street, which has a host of interest points, such as Hole in the Wall pub and a side street on the right next to Pandora that leads to Pallant Gallery. Next to Halifax, you will see a narrow alley with a black gate titled 'Oxmarket Gallery'. At the very end of East Street in Cattle Market car park, a car boot sale takes place every Sunday.

Roman walls



Chichester was once the Roman town of Noviomagus Reginorum- the walls built around the town are still present today, with more than 80% of the original structure still standing. The walls are 1800 years old.
