Code of conduct for education loans

In order to prohibit a conflict of interest with the responsibilities of an agent with respect to private education loans, all staff at the University of Chichester with responsibility for Federal and Private education loans from the U.S. are prohibited from:

- revenue-sharing arrangements with any lender
- receiving gifts from a lender, a guarantor, or a loan servicer
- contracting arrangements providing financial benefit from any lender or affiliate of a lender
- directing borrowers to particular lenders or refusing or delaying loan certifications
- · offers of funds for private loans
- · call centre or financial aid office staffing assistance
- · advisory board compensation.

Programmes ineligible for Federal Student Aid

We are unable to offer federal loans to students on certain ineligible courses. Ineligible courses include courses which are less than half-time, are not degree-bearing and courses with online or distance learning elements.

In addition, the following are not eligible for US Federal Aid:

- Non-degree bearing programmes e.g. CertHE.
- Taking part in a study abroad programme unless it is with a Title IV eligible institutions (see study abroad information below).
- Nursing degrees.

Study in the UA

Please note that students are not eligible for Direct loan funds if their study includes periods of study or research in the US.

If you are a PhD student planning to spend your writing up period in the US in order to conduct specific US related research, please speak to Chichester International Advice (international@chi.ac.uk) regarding the

Study Abroad and Exchange

Most University of Chichester students studying at undergraduate level have the option of adding a voluntary study abroad/exchange component to their studies. Students in receipt of Federal Aid need to consider the following points:

- The host institution abroad must be a Title IV eligible institution. You can request a list of eligible institutions from the Financial Aid team.
- Study abroad/exchange that takes place in the United States is prohibited.

If you are taking part in a programme which involves study abroad or exchange, please email Chichester International Advice international@chi.ac.uk as this may affect your eligibility for US federal loans. You can request a list of Title IV eligible institutions the team (international@chi.ac.uk).

In the UK, the power to award degrees is regulated by law and the Privy Council is responsible for the granting of degree awarding powers and university titles. National Student Loan data System (NSLDS).

If you take out a federal loan we will submit the details of your loan to NSLDS and this data will be accessible to guaranty agencies, lenders and schools determined to be authorised users of the data system.

Before first disbursement, first-time borrowers must complete and submit proof of completion of Entrance Counselling which is available on the https://studentaid.gov/ website.

Exit Counselling for Federal Student Loan Borrowers

Before completing your studies at the University of Chichester, you must complete and submit proof of completion of Exit Counselling which is available on the https://studentaid.gov/ website. Any student who fails to complete exit counselling via https://studentaid.gov/ will be emailed a copy of the exit counselling guide, produced by the US Department of Education.

Private Student Loans Disclosures and Preferred Lender List

We advise that you investigate US federal loans before applying for a US private student loan, as federal loans are often cheaper and most US students are eligible for them. US private student loans do not enable you to borrow more funds than US federal loans. The same Cost of Attendance calculations apply.

The University will certify loan requests from Sallie Mae.

Please note that Sallie Mae is not a 'preferred lender', but the only private lender willing to lend to students at foreign schools. In the event of other companies deciding to choose to take the opportunity to lend to foreign school students we will make sure they will be given equal visibility.

Retention rate
