

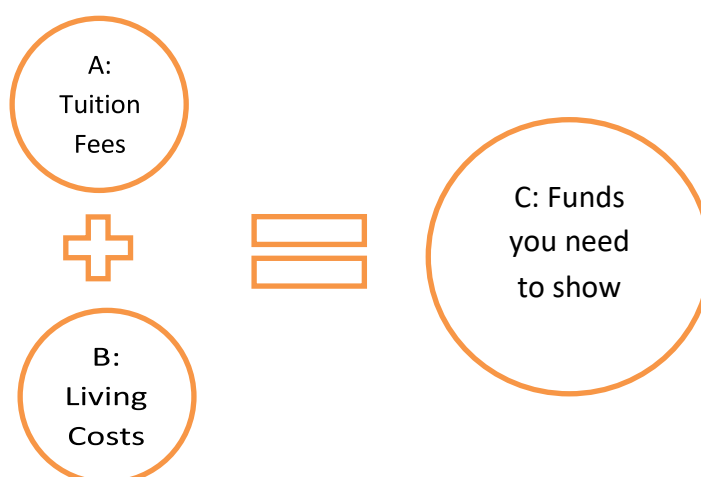
WORKSHEET: FUNDS CALCULATOR

When you apply for your Student Route visa you will be asked to submit evidence of having enough money to meet the [financial requirements](#).

**Please note that some nationalities are exempt from having to show evidence of meeting the financial requirements. Please see our website for more information on this.*

This worksheet will help you calculate how much money you need to show as part your visa application.

You must show you have enough money to cover tuition fees and living costs.



To calculate the funds for your application, fill in the

blank boxes below

Tuition Fees:

You must show that you have enough money to pay the [tuition fees](#) for the first academic year of your course. You can find your tuition fees on your offer letter or your CAS.



Living Costs (Maintenance)

How many months do you have to show?


- The amount you must show depends on your degree length.
- You must show at least £1,136 per month (outside London).
- The maximum months you need to show for your living costs is capped at 9 months.
- You will need to check your CAS for the start and end date of your degree.

Money already paid to University of Chichester

Any money already paid to the University for course fees and/or university arranged accommodation can be **subtracted** from the money you have to show. These amounts should be shown on the CAS “fees paid” section. The maximum accommodation fee you can subtract is £1,483.

D1 = £

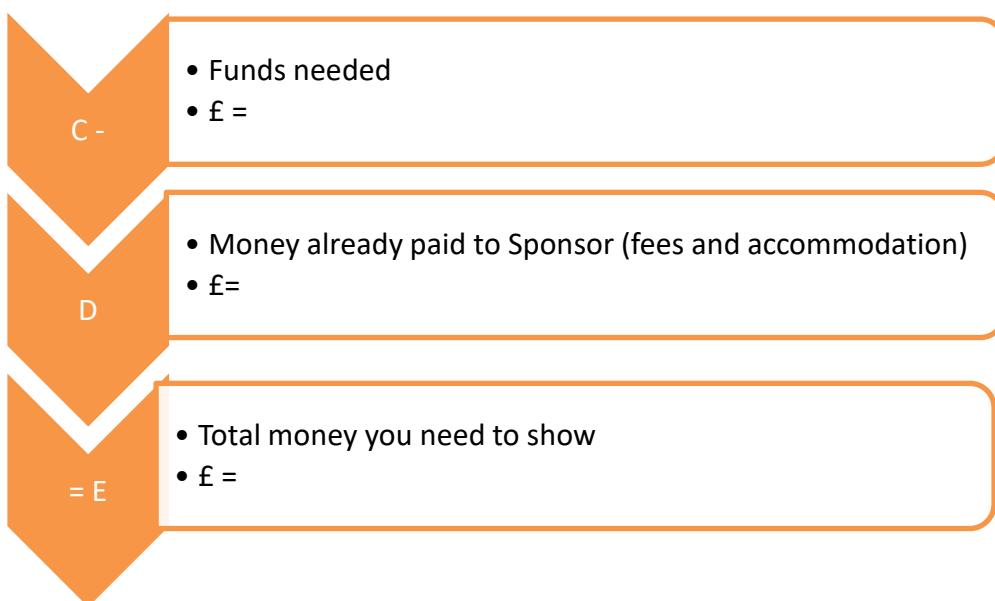
D1 = course fees already paid e.g. your deposit

D2 = £

D2 = accommodation fees already paid

D = £

D = Total D1+D2



Example:

An undergraduate student on a course lasting 12 months or more must show the following funds:

- Tuition fees: £16,344 (first year)
- Living costs: £1,136 x 9 months= 10,224
- Total Funds needed: £26,568
- Minus the tuition fee deposit: 50%
- Total Funds the student needs to show: £18,396

Evidence

Dependants

If you are allowed to bring dependants (spouse or children) with you, then you will also need to show maintenance for each dependant.
