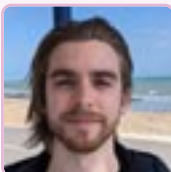

WORLD-LEADING RESEARCH

Teaching at the university is informed and influenced by the research, professional practice, innovation and enterprise activity undertaken by our academics.

Here at Chichester you won't just hear about the research – you will be taught by the researchers themselves. This is something we are extremely

proud of and we believe it gives you a huge advantage when it comes to your studies.

In the latest Research Excellence Framework (REF), which is an assessment of a university's research output, 86% of our research was rated as internationally renowned, with 12% classified as world-leading. Here are a few examples of research, carried out by leading experts in their fields.

DR PHIL BIRCH

- Senior Lecturer in Sport and Exercise Psychology in the Institute of Applied Sciences

INVESTIGATING FACTORS INFLUENCING MENTAL HEALTH IN ESPORTS

Dr Birch completed his PhD in 2014 which developed instruments to measure mental toughness in sport, and subsequently joined the team at the University of Chichester. He is currently a member of the Research Ethics Committee and the Institute of Applied Sciences CHASER research planning group for the Research Excellence Framework (REF) submission in 2028. His main area of research interest is performance psychology in traditional sports and esports. His research activity in the psychology of esports field is reflected by his role on the Editorial Board for the Journal of Electronic Gaming and Esports.

Despite the well-documented brevity of esports player careers, and a string of high-profile players recently needing time out from competition due to mental health concerns, the factors influencing the performance and mental health of esports athletes has received little research attention. Building on initial findings highlighting the significant stressors esports athletes face, Dr Birch conducted a multi-national study and first of its kind study to examine the risk factors of mental ill health in professional players.



Its findings are now starting to equip gaming companies with the knowledge they need to support professional players and understand the intense demands of professional gameplay. With esports expected to be worth over \$1.6bn by 2025, this research promises to have significant impact for years to come.

PROFESSOR ANTONINA PEREIRA

- Professor of Neuropsychology and Neuroscience, Cross-Institutional Lead for Research, Director of the Institute of Psychology, Business and Human Sciences



A NEW MODEL OF DEMENTIA CARE CAN CUT COSTS BY UP TO 38%

Professor Pereira is a chartered psychologist and Associate Fellow of the British Psychological Society as well as a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. She leads the Cognitive Ageing and Dementia Research Lab at the University of Chichester. She has a PhD in Psychology and an MSc in Research Methods in Psychology, as well as an MRes in Educational Psychology.

She is the leading investigator of numerous research projects which have led to the development of fruitful partnerships with a national (e.g. Memory Assessment Service, Sussex Partnership NHS; Centre for Integrative Neuroscience and Neurodynamics, University of Reading, Sage House, Tangmere) and international (e.g. Donders Institute for Brain, Cognition and Behaviour, Radboud University; Institute of Molecular Medicine, University of Lisbon) scope.

Her research is focused on prospective memory assessment and rehabilitation in mild cognitive impairment and prodromal Alzheimer's disease through behavioural and functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) paradigms. The relevance and currency of this topic has led to funding for research to develop a new psychometric tool for the assessment of prospective memory across the

lifespan and the chance to explore the neurophysiological mechanisms of ageing.

Researchers including Professor Pereira presented findings to MPs in Parliament to show how a new model of dementia care can cut costs by up to 38%. The integrated care model pioneered by Sage House in Tangmere, West Sussex, reduces the burden on the NHS and social care and demonstrated it costs less to run than current alternative NHS services.



DEBRA LAXTON

- Senior Lecturer in Education, Early Childhood Lead in the Institute of Education and Social Sciences



ACADEMIC WORKS WITH CHILDREN ON THE EDGE IN UGANDA

Debra's research explores how translational research, the movement of research-informed knowledge into professional use, can impact on educator practice to enhance the lives and experiences of young children both in global crisis settings and schools and settings in the United Kingdom. She has published various articles and book chapters relating to play-based learning and educator empowerment for improved practice.

She was part of a team of academics from our early years education team who joined forces with children's charity, Children on the Edge, to assess

whether their early years programme is having a positive impact on the refugee children they work with in Uganda.

The project arose out of frustration with existing early years assessment tools. The University of Chichester worked closely with Learn to Play Botswana and Children on the Edge to develop a new play-based observational assessment. This has led to a new daily routine for the children in Uganda with more time for free play and social interactions which help develop creative thinking skills and social and emotional skills.





PROFESSOR LAURA RITCHIE

- Professor of Learning and Teaching in the University of Chichester Conservatoire, National Teaching Fellow Coordinator of Instrumental/ Vocal Teaching and MA Programmes

PROFESSOR HELPS DEAF CHILDREN VISUALISE SOUND

Professor Ritchie's musical background is as a classical cellist, originally training in Chicago with Hans Jensen before coming to the UK to pursue her master's and PhD at the Royal College of Music. Laura's PhD research centred on distinguishing self-beliefs for learning and performing by creating and validating questionnaires to measure self-efficacy in psychological studies.

She is conducting research into how music is experienced. Not only can her music be heard, but it can also be seen through cymatics, where sand forms patterns on a surface to match the musical notes. It is even possible to feel the music, by listening via bone-conducting speakers and also by touching the instrument as it plays. Laura's project, called



Resonance, involves performing a piece of music (*Resonance* written by Jill Jarmon) on her cello, and then gathering audience reactions to it. She has invited members of the public to experience the multisensory form of her music, allowing everyone to hear, see and feel the piece, as well as helping deaf and hearing-impaired people to visualise the sound.

She organised a workshop where both hearing and deaf children experienced the music and then drew and wrote about it. Laura said: *"The children had life-changing experiences. They each laid hands on the cello to feel the different high and low sounds and different articulations, and then experienced Resonance progressively – first with the images, and then with the speakers. They were encouraged to document their experience and their writing and drawing was astonishing."*

Why the University of Chichester?

Choosing a university was a big deal for me as I was returning to education as a mature student, and it had to feel right. The University of Chichester stood out for me from the moment I stepped onto campus for my adult nursing interview. The passion from the nursing faculty made you feel passionate about it. The campus itself is very calm and relaxing, it's not as overwhelming as other universities as it's smaller than most. For this reason, the university has a strong community feel to it, everyone you meet is friendly and will be happy to talk to you.

Favourite thing about studying here?

The nursing school facilities at the University of Chichester are brand new and I am incredibly proud to be a nursing student here. There is so much support available to you to help you with your studies, whether it's late nights in the library before an assignment deadline, or help with careers, you have access to it all. Nothing seems too much trouble here and that's one of my favourite things about the university. I like that the University of Chichester is very inclusive of everyone, it prides itself on this and it shows!

Emily's day...

Morning: A typical morning for me starts at 6am and it is pretty hectic as I have two small children. Once they're settled at school and I arrive at the university, I can relax and enjoy my morning lecture. The lectures are delivered in a way that keeps you interested – they're interactive and involve discussions. There's always time for a quick coffee break mid-morning too, the campus has two Costa outlets which is a dream for a coffee lover like me.

Afternoon: After lunch we usually have another lecture or a clinical skills session depending on what we're up to that day. If it's a clinical skills day, the afternoon is spent preparing us for when we go out into practice.

We have amazing equipment to help us learn the new skills, including interactive, computerised mannequins to train with.

Evening: The evenings are my time to relax. Once I've put my children to bed I enjoy nothing more than lighting a scented candle and chilling out on the sofa. I alternate the nights that I study but if there is pre-reading to complete for my upcoming lectures, I will do this in the evenings. 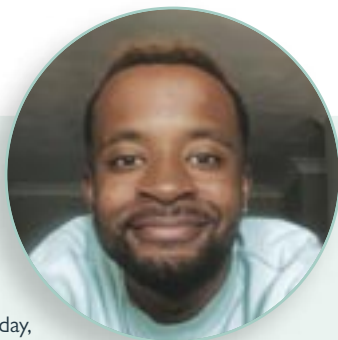
Jehlani's day...

After getting dressed for the day, I check my calendar and get some reading done while quietly streaming music. 9:45am is when I pack my bag and head out for the first of the day's two lectures and/or seminars – relaxed, with more than enough time to interact with friends and finish some tasks.

Afternoon: Friends and I head for lunch at Otters Restaurant before our next lecture. SPORTING EXCELLENCE

Sport is a huge part of Chichester and we take it seriously; whether that is through our world-leading research and consultancy, competitive league sports, Gifted Athlete Support Programme or helping those who just want to get healthier through using our facilities and exercise referral scheme.

We have a wide range of facilities accessible to you at the University of Chichester, including the Tudor Hale Centre for Sport.

The centre incorporates a suite of state-of-the-art physiology and biomechanics laboratories; clinical teaching spaces; a sports injury clinic and rehabilitation room; a fitness suite with cardio, resistance, functional movement and strength and conditioning areas; and a sports hall that is used for basketball, netball, trampolining, badminton, cricket, soccer, table tennis, hockey and ultimate frisbee.

Specialist facilities include our Sport Performance and Rehabilitation Unit (SPRU) and an environmental climate chamber to simulate extreme heat, cold and altitude.

Our Sports Dome, with a sprung floor, features three courts for netball, basketball, futsal, and handball, one volleyball court, and four tennis courts. It is regularly used for teaching and training practice by our sports clubs and teams. Outdoors we have an AstroTurf pitch, a synthetic J-track with jumps areas, a range of high-quality grass pitches, outdoor and indoor climbing walls and boulder, and an outdoor multi-purpose hard court.

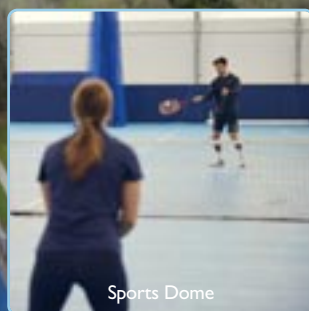

GOING FOR GOLD

We have supported athletes over six Olympic cycles. Athletes includes Chichester honorary graduate Hannah Mills OBE who until the Paris 2024 Olympic games, was the most successful female Olympic sailor of all time, winning her second gold at the Tokyo 2020 games in the 470 event. She retired from the sport in 2021; Paralympian and alumna Emma Wiggs who won gold at Paris 2024 in the 200m VL2 event; Sir Ben Ainslie CBE, honorary graduate and gold medallist in yachting and Saskia Clark MBE, alumna and gold medallist sailor.



HONORARY GRADUATES

We awarded both Geva Mentor CBE and Marieanne Spacey-Cale MBE with honorary doctorates of sport. Geva was an international netball player for England Vitality Roses. Marieanne is considered one of England's greatest footballers with 91 caps and 28 goals. She is currently the Head of Women's and Girls' Football at Southampton Football Club.





RESEARCH INTO WHAT MAKES RONALDO SO GOOD AT FOOTBALL

Dr Neal Smith, Reader in Sports Biomechanics in the Institute of Applied Sciences, worked with Cristiano Ronaldo to look at sprinting, shooting, jumping and dribbling techniques. Findings showed he can jump like a basketball player and sprint like a 100m athlete. His average leap is 78cm (2ft 5in), 7cm higher than the average NBA player!



HOME TO ONE OF ONLY ELEVEN FA WOMEN'S HIGH-PERFORMANCE CENTRES

We have been one of eleven FA Women's High-Performance Football Centres since 2018. The aim of the centre is to develop females in football as players and coaches with top-quality academic facilities and support.

TRAINING THE WORLD'S TOUGHEST ENDURANCE ATHLETES

The university's advanced environmental climate chamber helps some of the world's toughest endurance athletes prepare for the 156-mile Marathon des Sables. Competitors of the annual ultra-marathon train in the chamber as it can replicate extreme temperatures from -20 to +50 degrees Celsius, and simulate altitudes of up to 9000 metres.

COMMUTING TO UNIVERSITY

People choose to commute to university for many reasons including work and family commitments. Whatever your reason for commuting, you don't have to miss out on the student experience that comes with university life.

We have lots of spaces across the campus for your downtime in between study such as Otters Restaurants, Costa, quiet study spaces and even a gym. There are also commuting lockers at each campus for you to rent out for free.

We have bus stops on both campuses which are scheduled stops for many services including the Coastliner 700 which runs between Portsmouth and Brighton, including between Bognor and Chichester. The university also subsidises travel on Stagecoach bus service U7 which means students can travel to and from our offsite accommodation sites for easy access to both campuses.

TRAIN

Chichester train station is a 20-minute walk from Bishop Otter campus and Bognor Regis train station is a 15-minute walk from the Bognor Regis campus. Both have direct rail links to London Victoria. Chichester also has direct trains to Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton. Bognor Regis is accessible along coastal routes as well as direct trains from North Sussex (Crawley, Horsham, Pulborough).

CYCLE

Both campuses have fully secure sheltered bike sheds, where you can safely leave your bike throughout the day. There are approximately 190 covered spaces at Chichester campus and 90 covered spaces at Bognor Regis campus which are all free of charge.



CAR

We encourage students to use alternative methods of travel onto our campuses as we try to help reduce our carbon footprint and create a culture of environmental awareness. However, non-local students can apply for a permit to park, once this is completed and your permit is approved, you will be sent a link to set up an online payment account.



We also offer a car share scheme that students can apply for. This will save you money and help us work towards reducing carbon emissions and congestion.

Just over a third of our students currently commute into the university for their studies, so if you decide not to live on campus you won't be alone.

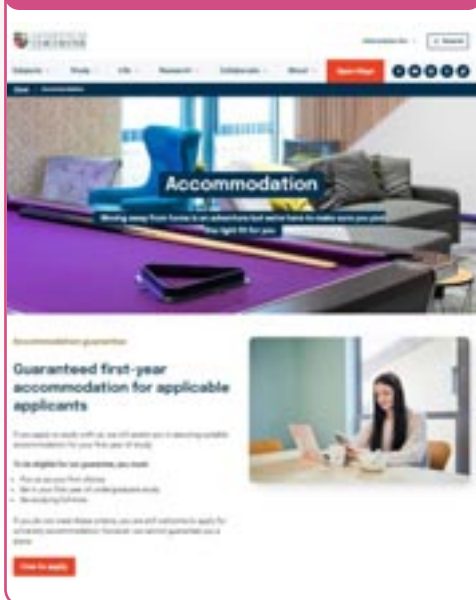

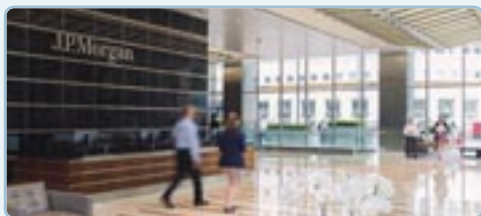

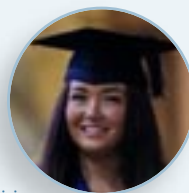

Our degrees provide you with a strong foundation of business knowledge in preparation for a graduate-level job. Most of our degrees are also accredited by professional organisations such as ACCA, CIM, CIMSPA and CIPD, which means your course content aligns with professional bodies and current industry requirements. 1. Industrial Placement in the UK or abroad*

We offer a 48-week paid internship where you can gain work experience in the career route or sector you are interested in. Whilst most of our placements are in the UK, there are opportunities to go on an overseas placement.

2. Professional Practice*

In your final year, you will complete a part-time placement to develop your employability in preparation for graduation. Depending on your interests, we offer three different types of placement on the Professional Practice module: a traditional industry placement, working remotely on a project for a client, or as an entrepreneur, where you focus on setting up your own business to see if it would be viable.

Why Chichester

Studying music at the University of Chichester offers you the opportunity to study a range of different musical styles, genres and approaches. You'll be able to tailor the course to your interests and strengths, and join a large number of choirs, orchestras and ensembles as part of a close community of performers. You will also develop your theoretical and contextual knowledge, enhance your performance and prepare yourself for a role in the music industry.

All of our staff are active, practising professional musicians and researchers who regularly perform and record. Around 140 professional tutors regularly visit campus throughout the semester to teach instrumental and vocal one-to-one lessons, as well as ensemble coaching.

We have six orchestras, nine other large ensembles, five choirs and more than 70 small ensembles for you to join. We also have a variety of vocal and ensemble opportunities relating to a large array of productions and shows across the conservatoire. Every year orchestral tours travel overseas to Western Europe, Eastern Europe or the USA. In addition, scholarship awards are available for postgraduate study and are given at the discretion of the conservatoire director. These awards are generously supported by the Chichester Music Society.

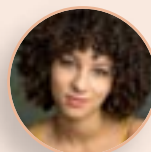

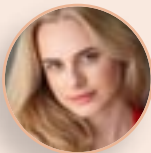

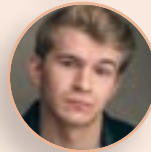

Our teaching emphasises learning in small groups rather than large lecture theatres which allows us to talk openly and really explore and challenge our assumptions about what we are, how we think and the nature of the world around us.

All students also have an optional work placement module so that you can learn to apply your critical skills to the world and the workplace. A skills audit helps you home in on the perfect area for your personal and professional development.

With employment application support as well as subject-specific input, you will develop transferable employability skills. You will also have the opportunity to reflect critically on your experience as you identify further areas for future learning and development needs.

Study abroad

In a globalised world, experiencing living and studying in another country can be invaluable in giving you a head start. Students on all degrees have the option of an academic exchange programme to North America or Europe (for one or two semesters) which will allow you to live abroad in an international environment of your choice.

Graduate prospects

Our students pursue a wide range of careers after graduating. Teaching philosophy, religion and/or ethics in secondary schools is a popular destination. Other students have pursued post-graduate education in a variety of areas including philosophy, creative writing, environmental policy and gender and sexuality studies. From working with the police to the civil service to HR, studying philosophy equips with the skills needed to navigate a rapidly changing job sector.

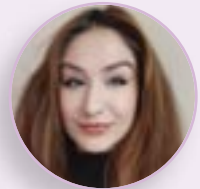

Physiotherapy at Chichester is highly practical, equipping you with the real-life skills that employers are looking for.

These skills are developed through a combination of lectures with practical sessions, self-directed learning and practice-based experience in a wide range of surroundings. With our dedication to smaller class sizes, our team of expert and experienced physiotherapists really get to know you and how best to support your learning.

Our degrees place an emphasis on person-centred care and inter-professional learning which is driven by research-informed teaching. Teaching and learning activities are supported by our clinical partners and service users and carers. Modules are contemporary, which include specialisms such as MSK, neuro, and cardio-respiratory alongside population health and psychology.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

On the BSc (Hons) Physiotherapy degree you will undertake a minimum of 1,000 hours of supervised clinical experience as per the requirements of the Chartered Society of Physiotherapists (CSP). Practice-based placements are organised by the course team and hosted in a range of settings that reflect the contemporary role of physiotherapists.

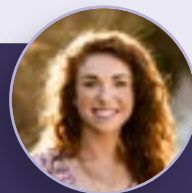

WORK OPPORTUNITIES

We are dedicated to helping you graduate with all the skills you need to find a career in your chosen field. With our work placements and part-time job opportunities, you will gain an edge when finding and applying for your first career role.

WORK PLACEMENTS

All our degree courses teach vocational skills and many also offer the option of doing a work placement. They give you the opportunity to implement skills and knowledge gained during your time on campus in a real-world setting and develop your employability skills. These are recognised as an integral part of your studies and are credit bearing. For some courses, work placements are a compulsory part of your degree; for others, these are optional.

We offer two main options

- Short work placements: these are typically from 25 to 350 hours during semesters. For some courses, such as business courses, the work placements are project-based experiences that are linked to your dissertation.
- Year in Industry: an employer of your choice will offer you a 12-month contract. This should be relevant to your degree and is often known as a sandwich year. The placement starts at the end of your second year, and you will return to the university on its completion for your final year.

WHY DO A WORK PLACEMENT?

Doing a work placement can help with:

- finding your career path
- strengthening your CV
- being more confident
- understanding the recruitment process
- acquiring business etiquette and language
- practising your knowledge and skillsets (both theoretical and practical)
- increasing your chances of employment after you graduate

Description of my work placement:

In my role I have supported all countries in the EMEA region. Our team oversees pay reviews for all these countries including benchmarking using market data. We also oversee the short time incentive plans and our recognition platform. We deal with all things benefits for all employees across our region. I have also worked with the global team on some of the bigger projects that they are working on. In addition, I have had the chance to organise some events such as our team workshops in Brussels.

What does a typical day look like?

Every day is different and changes every week. However, if I am in the office, I will normally find a desk and then catch up with all my colleagues whilst getting a coffee, and then check my emails and messages. I then look at my calendar to see what meetings I have for the day. If I have to do anything for that meeting, I will make sure I do it ready for the meeting. I make a to-do list on what I need to get done that day. If I have anything urgent, I will block out time in my calendar to make sure I do it on time.

What do you think you have learned on placement that would have been difficult to learn in class?

I have learned a mixture of soft and hard skills that have developed me both personally and professionally. Placements give you experience in a real working environment and how you can use what you have learnt in class in a practical setting. I have also expanded my network both inside and outside of the company.

Would you recommend doing a placement?

I would 100% recommend doing a year placement. It is a great way of learning and developing yourself. It also allows you to add more experience to your CV and helps you answer questions in future interviews.

English Language Requirements (IELTS or equivalent)

The University of Chichester accepts several examinations as proof of English language proficiency, including IELTS. To view the full range of examinations accepted visit: chi.ac.uk/english-language-requirements

For most undergraduate courses, standard undergraduate English requirements are IELTS 6.0 overall with no lower than 5.5 in each component

(or equivalent). For International Top-Up courses, the English language requirement is IELTS 5.5 overall, with no component less than 5.5 (or equivalent).

3. ACCEPTANCE AND CONFIRMATION

Accept your offer online. If your offer is conditional, email your final transcript and English language certificate to Admissions to make it unconditional.



4. DEPOSIT

Once your offer is unconditional and you have accepted your place, you will be asked to pay a tuition fee deposit to secure your place. If you don't need a visa or are in receipt of government funding you won't need to pay a deposit.



5. CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE FOR STUDIES

You will be asked to complete an online form and to send documents required for your visa by email. You will then be sent a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), so that you can apply for a student route visa.

We welcome applicants with a range of level three qualifications, including A levels, Scottish Advanced Highers, the Pearson BTEC National Extended Diploma, the OCR Cambridge Technical Extended Diploma, T levels, the International Baccalaureate Diploma, and the Access to HE Diploma. Contextual offers

Documentary evidence

All offers of a place at the university, whether conditional or unconditional, require proof of the applicant's qualifications. Applicants will normally be required to provide original certificates or official

results statements. This may include exams taken at GCSE/O Level. Failure to provide evidence of meeting the offer and entry requirements may result in the withdrawal of the place.

Non-standard entry for mature applicants

We offer an alternative entry procedure for mature applicants who do not hold the formal qualifications outlined in the course information pages, but have the relevant skills, experience and subject knowledge. This involves completing assignments related to the subject area. Mature applicants should still apply through UCAS for all full-time undergraduate programmes included in this prospectus. Part-time applicants should apply directly to the university.

INTERVIEWS

Will I be called for an interview or an audition?

Practice varies from course to course. For courses in the creative arts, some sports courses and professional courses (such as allied health or teacher training), applicants who have made a good application and meet the relevant admissions criteria are called for an interview/audition.

For other courses, a decision will be based on your application form. If your application is successful (without an interview), you will normally be invited (post-offer) to attend an optional applicant day. This gives you the opportunity to see the campus, accommodation and facilities, and meet academics, support staff, current students and potential classmates. Rest assured that if you do not book an applicant day this has no impact on your application.

HOW TO APPLY

You should apply through UCAS for full-time undergraduate programmes. The UCAS institution code name for the university is CHICH. The UCAS institution code number is C58. For PGCE programmes, please apply via the Department for Education's (DfE) 'Get into Teaching' website.

You will need to use the UCAS institution and course codes when applying via UCAS. You may apply to up to five institutions. The application fee is £28.50 (2025 entry price).

When do I apply?

Ideally, you should apply via UCAS before the January equal consideration deadline. Later applications should still be submitted in the same way, via UCAS. For most programmes, the university will still consider applications made after the January deadline.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Disclosure and Barring Service Enhanced Disclosure

Successful applicants to courses that involve contact with children or vulnerable adults are required to obtain at their own cost a satisfactory Enhanced Disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS). The Admissions Office team will guide you through the DBS process after you have accepted an offer of a place.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH DECLARATION

All successful applicants who will be training to become teachers, counsellors, nurses, physiotherapists, early years professionals or social workers, are required to have their mental and physical health checked before beginning their studies.

This is in order to demonstrate 'fitness to practise'. All places are conditional on a satisfactory outcome confirming fitness to practise.

APPLICATIONS FROM OUTSIDE THE UK

Qualifications gained outside the UK may be accepted for entry, provided that the qualifications are considered to be equivalent to the admissions criteria outlined on the course information pages. The university uses UK ENIC as a guide:

English language

Applicants whose first language is not English will be required to provide evidence of English language proficiency. This is normally evidenced through an exam such as International English Language Testing System (IELTS). The university also accepts a number of other widely recognised tests. For applicants whose IELTS score is slightly too low, the university runs English language preparation courses to raise your IELTS score by 1.0 (starting in July) or by 0.5 (starting in August).

International students should apply via UCAS (unless there is a specific progression agreement with your school or college).

Confirming your place – international students who require a visa

When you accept your offer of a place to study at the university, you will need to pay a deposit of 50% of your first year tuition fees to confirm your place. Deposits are later deducted from your tuition fees. We can then process your 'Certificate of Acceptance for Studies' (CAS) so you can apply for your visa.

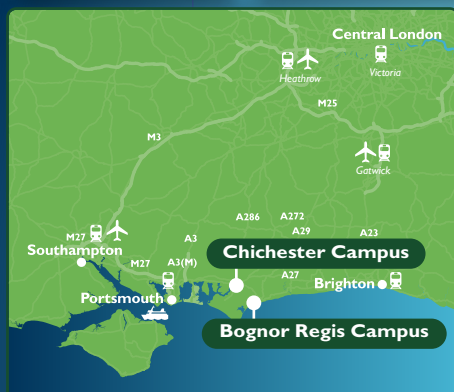
