4. Get prepared

Some courses ask for a portfolio, interview or audition. Don't worry, we'll let you know if that applies to you and what you need to do. Our website, socials and YouTube channel are packed with tips to help you prepare.

5. Come to an applicant day (February – April)




City Centre living

Just a five-minute walk from the sea, our Bognor Regis campus combines historic Regency architecture with modern, state-of-the-art facilities.

The flagship £35m Tech Park was opened by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex in 2018, and brings together science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics courses on one state-of-the-art site.

It includes a 250 square-metre, three-storey high sound stage, which is one of only three in the UK capable of holding a professional orchestra, as well as green screens, recording studios and engineering labs.

On campus you'll also find beautiful Georgian architecture, including three grand mansion houses; St Michael's, the Dome and Mordington House.


The campus is also close to Hotham Park, a beautiful 22-acre public park which surrounds Hotham House, built in 1792 by Sir Richard Hotham, which is regarded by many as one of the finest Georgian houses in Sussex.



Our halls are professionally managed, secure and well-maintained. You will be supported by our team in the Accommodation Office. Our Accommodation offices are open from 8.00am to 4.30pm, and Security operate from 4.30pm to 8.00am weekdays and 24-hours at weekends so you can feel safe and right at home.



How to apply

Check out your options

Choosing your accommodation is a big part of your university experience – and we've got options to suit every lifestyle, budget, and preference.

On-Campus Living

Want everything in one place? Our on-campus accommodation at both Chichester and Bognor Regis means less commuting and more convenience. You'll be just steps away from lectures, libraries, cafés, and social spaces.

Room Types: Choose between ensuite rooms (your own private bathroom) or shared bathroom options.

Catering Choices:

Go catered for flexible meal options included in your rent or self-catered if you prefer to cook your own meals.

Off-Campus Options

Prefer to live off-campus? Our off-campus managed properties in Chichester and Bognor Regis offer a range of living styles.

Student Villages: Larger communities near shops, restaurants, and entertainment.

Residential Houses: Smaller, homely spaces with a more traditional layout. All Chichester properties are within a 30-minute walk of campus, and Bognor options are just 10 minutes away.

Many have bus links for easy travel between campuses. All off-campus accommodation is self-catered, with fully equipped kitchens and communal areas for cooking, relaxing, and socialising.

Room Types Explained

Ensuite Rooms: Your own private bathroom with a toilet, sink, and shower.

Shared Bathrooms: Single rooms with shared toilet and shower facilities, always with multiple facilities per flat. Sinks are installed in all bedrooms sharing bathrooms.

Catered vs. Self-Catered

Catered: Available on campus at Bognor Regis and most on-campus rooms at Chichester. You'll get a daily allowance to spend in campus dining areas £9.10* on weekdays and £4.50* on weekends. Communal kitchens are also available if you fancy cooking.

Self-Catered: Cook your own meals in shared kitchens equipped with all the essentials (hob, oven, microwave, fridge/freezer, kettle, toaster). Just bring your own utensils and cookware.

Adapted Rooms: We provide accessible rooms with large ensuite wet rooms for students with disabilities. These are available as catered or self-catered options. Reach out to our Disability and Dyslexia Service early so we can tailor your accommodation to your needs. Find out more please email disability@chi.ac.uk.

Parking Information

To support a greener, more sustainable city and reduce our environmental impact, we do not offer student parking at our Chichester campus, other than at Havenstoke Close. Students living on Bognor Regis campus or at Havenstoke Close, Chichester can apply for an annual parking pass. If you are allocated accommodation off campus you may be able to purchase a designated parking permit. Residents at Fishbourne Road East or Stockbridge are not permitted to bring a car into the city due to planning restrictions.



COMMUTING

to university

People choose to commute to university for many reasons including work and family commitments. Whatever your reason for commuting, you don't have to miss out on the student experience that comes with university life.

We have lots of spaces across the campus for your downtime in between study such as Otters restaurants, Déjà Brew coffee shops, quiet study spaces and even a gym. There are also commuting lockers at each campus for you to rent out for free.

If you choose to commute, you will be invited to all of the university social events and welcomed to join our clubs and societies. All campus support services, such as Student Support and Wellbeing, Admissions, Finance and Careers will be available to you.



Transport links

Our campuses are only a short walk from their respective town centres, with Chichester campus being 15 minutes away and Bognor Regis campus being only 10 minutes.



Bus

We have bus stops on both campuses which are scheduled stops for many services. The Coastliner 700 runs between Portsmouth and Brighton, and stops at both Bognor and Chichester. The university also subsidises travel on Stagecoach bus service 707 which means students can travel to and from our offsite accommodation sites for easy access to both campuses.

Train

Chichester train station is a 20-minute walk from Bishop Otter campus and Bognor Regis train station is a 15-minute walk from the Bognor Regis campus. Both have direct rail links to London Victoria. Chichester also has direct trains to Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton. Bognor Regis is accessible along coastal routes as well as direct trains from North Sussex (Crawley, Horsham, Pulborough).

Cycle

Both campuses have fully secure sheltered bike sheds, where you can safely leave your bike throughout the day. There are approximately 190 covered spaces at Chichester campus and 90 covered spaces at Bognor Regis campus which are all free of charge.



Car

We encourage students to use alternative methods of travel onto our campuses to support a greener, more sustainable city and reduce our environmental impact. However, non-local students can apply for a permit to park, once this is completed and your permit is approved, you will be sent a link to set up an online payment account.



We also offer a car share scheme that students can apply for. This will save you money and help us work towards reducing carbon emissions and congestion.

A third of our new full-time undergraduate students commute into the university for their studies, so if you decide not to live on campus you won't be alone.



1. APPLY

For most undergraduate courses, international students can apply to the University of Chichester via UCAS, the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service, at ucas.com. For international top-ups, students can apply directly to the University.



2. RECEIVING AN OFFER

You will receive a conditional offer if you have not yet completed your academic or English language qualifications, or an unconditional offer if you have met all requirements.



4. DEPOSIT

Once your offer is unconditional and you have accepted your place, you will be asked to pay a tuition fee deposit to secure your place. If you are in receipt of government funding, you may not need to pay a deposit.



5. CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE FOR STUDIES

You will be asked to complete an online form and to send documents required for your visa by email. You will then be sent a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), so that you can apply for a student route visa.



Buster

University sometimes feels like it comes with its own language. Don't worry, we've got you covered. This guide breaks down the terms you'll hear most through your journey, so you can feel confident and in-the-know from day one.

DEGREE TYPES

Undergraduate

Undergraduates are students studying their first degree, usually following the completion of their A levels, BTECs or equivalent.

Foundation year

An extra preparatory year at the start of your undergraduate degree programme. It is designed to help you build academic and practical skills, develop subject knowledge and gain confidence before continuing with your full degree course.

Master's degree

A postgraduate course (usually one year) studied after completing an undergraduate degree.

MSci degree

Also called an integrated master's – an undergraduate degree programme (usually four years' duration) that includes a final year of master's-level study, resulting in a master's qualification upon completion.

PGCE / PGCert

If you have a bachelor's degree and are interested in gaining a qualification in education, you may want to do a postgraduate certificate in education (PGCE). We also offer postgraduate certificates (PGCert) in some other vocational subjects.

Degree apprenticeship

A university apprenticeship, also known as a degree apprenticeship, is a job that combines work with higher-level learning, leading to an undergraduate degree, a postgraduate degree or a vocational qualification.

FOUNDATION

Entry requirements

Each course will have its own entry requirements, often specifying the subjects you must already have studied, as well as the grades you'll need to have.

Types of offer

Conditional offer

An offer which usually (but not always) requires a student to achieve certain grades. There are sometimes additional or alternative conditions to a straightforward grade-based offer – but these will be communicated in the offer conditions.

Unconditional offer

An offer of a place on a course with no conditions attached – the place is theirs if the student wants it. The offer is normally made to people who have already got their grades or have auditioned/interviewed successfully.

Student loans

Funded by the government's regional student loan organisations (such as Student Finance England), student loans help cover tuition fees and living costs. Students who have lived in the UK or Republic of Ireland for three years are eligible. Repayment begins once you your income exceeds a set threshold, automatically repaid each month from your salary.

Tuition fee loan

This loan covers course fees and is generally paid direct to the university from your student loan organisation. All students are eligible for as loan to cover full fee costs regardless of household income.

Maintenance loan

This is paid direct to students in three instalments per year to help with living costs (rent, groceries, bills, books, socialising). The amount of the loan is dependent on parent/carer income.

Bursaries and scholarships

Funding given to students to support their education, usually based on personal circumstances, academic achievement, talent, or other specific criteria.

Bursaries are primarily awarded based on financial need; scholarships are merit-based and recognise academic excellence. Bursaries and scholarships do not need to be repaid although recipients may need to provide a report to the benefactor.

Lecture

A method of teaching at university. Large classes where a lecturer talks at the front whilst students take notes.

Seminar

Small group teaching that involves discussion with other students about your subject, led by teaching staff. These are more like classes at school or college.

Campus

The buildings and grounds of a university. Sometimes universities have more than one campus – like us! We have our city campus (called Bishop Otter) in Chichester and our beach campus in Bognor Regis.

Halls of residence

A block of accommodation where students live together for their first year. A larger type of student accommodation, usually used for first year students. It's a great way to meet new friends and often has utilities and common spaces included in the rent.

Graduation

The formal act of successfully completing your course of study and receiving your degree. Degrees are presented at a graduation ceremony where students, family and faculty celebrate their accomplishments.

Alumni

People who have completed their studies and graduated from a university.

You may choose to study abroad for one semester or an academic year. You will be entitled to a living cost grant of around £1,500 per semester, and may also be eligible for a travel grant. Extra support can be applied for to assist with any SEND requirements to provide funding and support for SEND students.

QUALIFICATIONS

This prospectus only lists the typical points / grades offer for each programme. Each application is considered on its individual merits.

We welcome applicants with a range of level three qualifications, including A levels, Scottish Advanced Highers, the Pearson BTEC National Extended Diploma, the OCR Cambridge Technical Extended Diploma, T levels, the International Baccalaureate Diploma, and the Access to HE Diploma. Contextual offers

Documentary evidence

All offers of a place at the university, whether conditional or unconditional, require proof of the applicant's qualifications. Applicants will normally be required to provide original certificates or official

results statements. This may include exams taken at GCSE/O Level. Failure to provide evidence of meeting the offer and entry requirements may result in the withdrawal of the place.

Alternative entry route for mature applicants

We offer an alternative entry procedure for mature applicants who do not hold the formal qualifications outlined in the course information pages, but have the relevant skills, experience and subject knowledge. This involves completing assignments related to the subject area. Mature applicants should still apply through UCAS for all full-time undergraduate programmes included in this prospectus. Part-time applicants should apply directly to the university.

INTERVIEWS

Will I be called for an interview or an audition?

Practice varies from course to course. For courses in the creative arts, some sports courses and professional courses (such as allied health or teacher training), applicants who have made a good application and meet the relevant admissions criteria are called for an interview/audition.

For other courses, a decision will be based on your application form. If your application is successful (without an interview), you will normally be invited (post-offer) to attend an optional applicant day. This gives you the opportunity to see the campus, accommodation and facilities, and meet academics, support staff, current students and potential classmates. HOW TO APPLY

You should apply through UCAS for full-time undergraduate programmes. The UCAS institution code name for the university is CHICH. The UCAS institution code number is C58. For PGCE programmes, please apply via the Department for Education's (DfE) 'Get into Teaching' website. You will need to use the UCAS institution and course codes when applying via UCAS. You may apply to up to five institutions. The application fee is £28.95 (2026 entry price). The application fee for 2027 is expected to be about £35.

When do I apply?

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Disclosure and Barring Service Enhanced Disclosure

Successful applicants to courses that involve contact with children or vulnerable adults are required to obtain at their own cost a satisfactory Enhanced Disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS). The Admissions Office team will guide you through the DBS process after you have accepted an offer of a place.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH DECLARATION

All successful applicants who will be training to become teachers, counsellors, nurses, physiotherapists, early years professionals or social workers, are required to have their mental and physical health checked before beginning their studies.

This is in order to demonstrate 'fitness to practise'. All places are conditional on a satisfactory outcome confirming fitness to practise.

APPLICATIONS FROM OUTSIDE THE UK

Qualifications gained outside the UK may be accepted for entry, provided that the qualifications are considered to be equivalent to the admissions criteria outlined on the course information pages. The university uses UK ENIC as a guide:

English language

Applicants whose first language is not English will be required to provide evidence of English language proficiency. This is normally evidenced through an exam such as International English Language Testing System (IELTS). The university also accepts a number of other widely recognised tests. For applicants whose IELTS score is slightly too low, the university runs English language preparation courses to raise your IELTS score by 1.0 (starting in July) or by 0.5 (starting in August).

International students should apply via UCAS (unless there is a specific progression agreement with your school or college).

Confirming your place – international students who require a visa

When you accept your offer of a place to study at the university, you will need to pay a deposit of 50% of your first year tuition fees to confirm your place. Deposits are later deducted from your tuition fees. We can then process your 'Certificate of Acceptance for Studies' (CAS) so you can apply for your visa.

FEBRUARY – JULY 2026

STUDENT FINANCE

There are two types of student loans for UK students:

- tuition fee loan – this is paid direct to the university from your loan company such as Student Finance England (this varies depending on where in the UK you live)
- maintenance loan – this is paid to you, the student, and helps cover living costs
- any loan you borrow needs to be paid back, but not until you've finished or left your course, and you earn over a certain amount
- you might get extra financial help on top of this, for example if you're on a low income, are disabled or have children. You do not usually need to pay back this extra help
- you can check your eligibility, find out how to apply and submit your application for student finance through the government student finance website


